## President Zola Brown's Message

My question to you 19<sup>th</sup> Ward neighbors: do we still have real estate problems and practices that seem similar to the reason the Association was formed in 1965?

The Association formed to deal with so many issues, but real estate problems in our neighborhood were a prime factor. The first committed group of Association members faced problems around racial issues when buying and selling property; large homes bought by investment companies or developers that were broken down into apartments, zoning issues, and other tactics used to control properties in the area. I am concerned about history repeating itself as we face these issues again today.

A few weeks ago my mother received a letter asking her to sell her home. Other friends who live in the neighborhood were visited or received calls to sell as well. Some folks are concerned about gentrification, a process that improves the quality of a neighborhood but causes families to be out priced, especially racial and ethnic groups. The housing market is slow and there are not a lot of selections available; that leaves investment companies and developers the opportunity to use their purchasing power. That same purchasing power can give seniors the incentive to sell if staying in a two-story home is difficult. Examples of this are realtors seeking homes to use for rental properties, off campus housing, or home flipping (another lucrative business). I'm not sure at this point the measure in which this issue is currently changing the quality of life in our neighborhood. If you are concerned and see the similarities, call our office and share your input with the Housing committee.

We want families to purchase homes. We should have responsible renters and landlords. The goal of the 19<sup>th</sup> Ward has always been about the quality of life for families in the neighborhood, a stable place to live, and diversity. Some of our neighbors are realtors who encourage families to purchase homes in the 19<sup>th</sup> Ward. The City and University of Rochester have incentive home programs in which 217 families have purchased homes in last 5 years. We must take care of our neighborhood, so families want to live here.

On March 9<sup>th</sup> 2019, on Arnett Blvd, another fire that left a building destroyed and 6 adults with children homeless. Arnett Blvd residents, New Life Church, Grace Family Medicine and Arnett Café came out to comfort the victims. They provided a few items, including food, to help them for the moment. These families still struggle. I have provided them with information on places to find clothing and furniture. On April 1, 2019 a group of us will gather at Arnett Library Community Room between 5pm – 7pm for Square Fair Volunteer Day. We will collect toiletries and gift cards for the Arnett victims. Sorry, no clothes or shoes. Your generosity for the Thurston Road victims helped fill Churches in our area and we don't have the capacity to store any items at the office.

Spring is around the corner. So it's time to get those gardens in shape, including our surrounding community. Let's work hard this year to turn our area into the "flower city." You can check out our website and Facebook for workshops, neighborhood gardening parties (free flowers), flower purchases, and much more. Your district delegate can help you with this information.

# Join us April 14 for the annual Palm Sunday breakfast held at the Rochester Presbyterian Home

For the 21st year the Rochester Presbyterian Home is hosting the Palm Sunday breakfast which was inaugurated by the Westminster Presbyterian Church originally located at Arnett and Wellington. Westminster Presbyterian had hosted the Palm Sunday breakfast for almost fifty years, but discontinued it after the sale of the church building. The church had many speakers over the course of the years, including Christopher Lindley. When the Southwest YMCA was looking for a fundraiser, the Y Board decided to resurrect the Palm Sunday breakfast. Y Board members Chris and Bettie Lindley took on the task in 1999 and subsequently turned it over to Jeanette Mewborn and Emma Joyner. Currently the breakfast is sponsored by St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, St. Monica Roman Catholic Church, and the Westminster Presbyterian Mission, in partnership with the 19<sup>th</sup> Ward Community Association and the Southwest YMCA.

The breakfast is a community-building event and a way to raise money for area charities. Past speakers have included University of Rochester President Joel Seligman, Police Chief Michael Ciminelli and Mayor Lovely Warren. Past beneficiaries have included SWEM, Sojourner House, Teen Empowerment, and Genesee Valley Little League. This year's recipient is the Southwest Family YMCA.

This year's speaker is Kevin Fitzpatrick who grew up in the nineteenth ward. He worked at Westminster Presbyterian church and lifeguarded at the Arnett YMCA. He currently is the Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer of the Greater Rochester Area YMCA. The YMCA is one of the largest non-profits in Rochester and the 10<sup>th</sup> largest employer in Rochester.

Kevin attended Springfield College and graduated with a degree in Human Service Administration.

He has worked in the Berkshires, Boston, and the southern tier during his 30 year YMCA career. He returned to Rochester 13 years ago to build and establish the Eastside YMCA.

He currently lives in Penfield with his wife Theresa and three grown children. Kevin credits much of his success in the YMCA to growing up in the 19<sup>th</sup> Ward.

The breakfast will be hosted by the Rochester Presbyterian Home, 256 Thurston Road the morning of Sunday, April 14 beginning at 8 AM and ending promptly at 9:30 AM (for those who are going to a church service). # 19th-Ward-centered Oral History Project

## Collaboration with University of Rochester Linguistics Department

Julianne Kapner, a senior Linguistics major at the University of Rochester, has been working since last summer on a 19th-Ward-centered Oral History project. Actually, she began as early as 2017, at Square Fair, to collect names of people willing to participate. She was looking for persons who were native Rochesterians. Julianne attended the February 2019 History & Archives Committee meeting to report on her project, which has evolved into her senior thesis. Julianne will be presenting her academic paper in late April.

She presented us with a binder containing the CDs of all the finalized public versions of the interviews she did. She had sent the initial unedited versions of the interviews to each participant, and they were given a chance to request deletions of any sections of their interviews that were for linguistics purposes only, and not for public consumption. There are 14 to 15 hours of audio in the public version. The interviews will be housed at the Rochester Voices Project website through the Rochester Public Library.

Julianne told us that her interview subjects remembered growing up in the 19th Ward, discussed major issues facing Rochester in general and the 19th Ward in particular, and shared favorite stories from their lives: travel adventures, how they met their spouses, significant historical events, and more.

We asked if her study fits into a larger picture. Julianne said that the study of language variation is a hot topic within linguistics right now. What she has done is part of a larger study of northern Great Lakes cities which include Chicago, Lansing, Buffalo, Syracuse and others. The Rochester accent had not been studied since the 1970s.

Engaging the community in her research broadened her focus beyond data and beyond the University bubble, and allowed her to connect with the people behind it. "What I loved most was the community collaboration. It benefited me in my heart, not just my career. Thank you, 19th Ward!"







## **19<sup>th</sup> Ward Community Association Presents 9<sup>th</sup> Annual Spelling Bee Competition**

The 19<sup>th</sup> Ward Community Association will present our 9<sup>th</sup> annual Spelling Bee Competition, taking place in Hoyt Hall, at the University of Rochester on Saturday, April 6 2019 from 1pm-4pm.



The Spelling Bee involves students in grades 3 through 6 from Dr. Walter Cooper Academy School No. 10, John Walton Spencer School No. 16, Dr. Charles T. Lunsford School No. 19, Adlai E. Stevenson School No. 29, and Lincoln Park School 44. Each school selects 2 finalists and one alternate per grade. The event is in partnership with the city of Rochester's 19th Ward Community Association, Rochester Area Community Foundation, the University of Rochester Admissions Office, Sigma Phi Epsilon Fraternity, the Rochester City School District, and the Arnett Branch Library.

The winners in each grade level are awarded a trophy, and a \$500 scholarship to be awarded when the student goes to college. A fund established at the Community Foundation supports the scholarships

# Delegates' Council Meeting, March 14, 2019 Update 19

Zola Brown, President, chaired the meeting.

--**US Census Update by Susan Perry, NY Regional Office, US Census Bureau.** Ms. Perry stated that the mission of the US Census Bureau is to provide quality data about US people, places and the economy. The Census Bureau administers several surveys including the Decennial Census, the American Community Survey, and a housing and an economic survey. The Decennial survey is required by the US Constitution. The goal is to count every resident of the US. The data is kept confidential; no law enforcement agencies can obtain or use the data. The Decennial Census determines the number of seats per state in the House of Representatives, and the allocation of federal funds. The Census Bureau will launch a marketing campaign in late 2019 and early 2020.. Residents will be asked to complete the survey on line. If a household does not respond, they will receive a request by US mail, and then by phone; and then a census representative will come to the door. The issue of including a question about citizenship will be settled by the US Supreme Court. Persons interested in a temporary job with the Census can apply on line.

--**Arnett Library,** Rochester Regional Health, with His Branches Health Services, will be sending a mobile van to Arnett Library parking lot on March 25 and every fourth Monday. Certified technicians will do mammograms for free. The library will be starting a teen book club, a knitting class and a Lego club.

--**University of Rochester** peace officers: UR convened an advisory board to give feedback re UR proposal to arm certain peace officers. Diane Watkins and Donald Hardaway represent 19<sup>th</sup> WCA on that board. A report to the UR President is expected at the end of March. UR is distributing an anonymous on line survey so that members of the public can express their opinions. 19<sup>th</sup> WCA encourages people to complete that on line survey.

--**IT services** update by Michael Phillipson: 19<sup>th</sup> WCA is transitioning to G Suite services. Our web site was moved to a less expensive hosting service. The web site is due for some upgrades.

--19<sup>th</sup> WCA will be undertaking a **strategic planning process**. Interested members should contact the office.

--**Key Bank** has announced that the branch at 532 Chili Ave. will be closed. 19<sup>th</sup> WCA sent a letter to Office of the Comptroller of the Currency, documenting the serious and negative impact of this bank closure on 19<sup>th</sup> ward residents and businesses. The priority for the 19<sup>th</sup> WCA is to locate/recruit another bank to provide financial services to the ward, as soon as possible.

--**Good news: Home Leasing** is purchasing Thurston Road and Chili Ave. apartment buildings. They have developed many units of affordable housing in NYS and Pennsylvania, including the Rochester area, and have an excellent reputation.

--**Celebrate City Living** is scheduled for April 13 at Sibley Square. Don't miss the **Palm Sunday Breakfast** on April 14, proceeds benefit our YMCA branch. **Ease on Down Thurston** will take place May 18 to 25. Volunteers are needed for **Square Fair** on June 1. **House Tour** is scheduled for Oct. 19, 2019. We need people to volunteer their houses.

**Rochester's Place in Music History: From Cab Calloway to Scorgie's to The Jazz Fest to The Rochester Music Hall of Fame**

**Jeff Spevak, longtime local arts writer and Rochester Democrat and Chronicle pop/rock critic for more than two decades, takes us on a personal and opinionated trip through Rochester's music scene in the 20th and 21st centuries.
